Gauteng Junior Championships

General items

- Dress code no jeans
- Arrive on time (at least 60 min before first race)
- Report to PoJ
- Check with PoJ before leaving
- Don't forget to bring:
 - Clip board, pen, hat, sun screen, binoculars
 - Rules of Racing, Officials Handbook, Regatta Notice
- Remember to keep calm
 - Treat all competitors and officials with respect
 - No shouting at the start

Gauteng champs

- Late entries allowed only if lanes are empty
 - A scratching does not make the lane available
 - CC needs to be careful of sculls scratchings/late entries
- JWU14 8x will be coxed by an open cox
- Heads races
- Crew or boat clashes will not be accommodated check with PoJ
- Read the Regatta Notice

Control Commission Boat checks

- Check bow ball, heel straps, hatch covers, bow number
- Record time boat is checked
- Be positive
 - If you do this you can row not you can't row because ...
- Boat weighing of selected boats (after racing)

Control commission Athlete checks

- IDs for selected crews
 - If no ID book, Warning (yellow card)
- Cox weighing
- Check that ballast is present when crews returns

Control commission Administration

- Record crews that have boated (also time)
- Record coxes that need ballast
- Record any issues

Aligner / Judge at the start

- Use correct commands
 - Touch (distance), back (distance), hold
 - Hold it all crews and raise white flag
- When race is started, check for false starts
 - Raise red flag and inform umpire
- Keep a note of all changes to schedule

Marshall

- Check crews and collect into groups
- Rack and stack behind umpire
- Check that crews adhere to traffic pattern
- Good marshalling can keep regatta on time

Umpire / Starter

- Check course is clear before starting race
- Get changes to schedule from Aligner
- Two minute rule:
 - At two minutes before race crews should be ready to race
 - Race should be started at race time
 - Warnings (yellow cards) for crews arriving after 2 minutes
- If crews are missing, do not start race ahead of time
- Make sure your pilot calls in the race
- Check dress code


Dress code

- Tri-suits must be the same
 - Careful when uniform is changed
 - Poorer schools cannot afford uniforms
 - Can give a warning (yellow card)
- Hats those worn must be the same
 - Do not have to wear a hat
- Same for undershirts and leggings
- Sunglasses are not controlled



Starter / umpire - basics

- Call the roll
 - Ensure that all the correct crews are in the race
- Call crews to the start
- Hand over to the Aligner
- Hold red flag horizontally
- Wait for aligner's "Hold it all crews"
- Call attention and raise the red flag
- Check white flag is still there
- After 1 to 5 seconds call "Go" and drop the flag to side
- Check that aligner does not call a false start



Considerations

- Two heats and only 8 crews left
 - Combine race?
 - What is the procedure?
- Rough wind use rolling starts
 - For all heats
- Boat gets damaged on way to start?
- Cox has hand raised? What do you do?
- Warnings (yellow cards) when race is re-rowed?

Umpire

- What flag protocol don't show flag when not used
- Don't steer crews unless
 - Crew is affecting another crew who is in its own water
 - Obstruction
- Remember safety of crews and boats
- Clear race at end with white flag
 - Give crews a chance to object especially if there was an incident

Pilot

- Call in race
 - Race no, umpire name and no, stand by for start, changing to channel 3
 - Hold radio open for Attention/Go
 - After race has started go back to channel 1 and call in DNS, scratching's etc.
- Second pair of eyes for umpire be vigilant
- If possible take start time of race
- Monitor radio

Finish tower

- Start timing officials
 - Record number of boats
 - Record start time and umpire name or number
- Finish timing officials
 - Use watch from same start timing official
- Judge at the finish
 - Record all details for race (DNS etc)
 - Sign results sheet

President of the Jury

Need to check on EVERYTHING

Safety Officer

- Rescue Start and Rescue Finish
- Brief rescue as to how to behave on water

Packing up afterwards

- Please help pack up the equipment before leaving
- Many hands make light work
